The Department of History, Culture & Society invites applications for an Assistant Professor in Sociology (tenure track) to begin August 2019. We are seeking a collegial, dynamic teacher/scholar who can teach a combination of three of the following: Criminal Justice, Law & Society, Race, and Gender. Individuals who can teach Spatial Analysis for the Social Sciences and GIS are especially encouraged to apply, although this is not required. Candidates should also be able to teach Core courses in Sociology including Principles of Sociology, and contribute to the unique General Education program at Baker, called *Quest*. Applicants must be committed to teaching four courses a semester in a small college setting and dedicated to student-centered learning. The doctorate must be completed by date of appointment.
