

Assistant/Associate Professor – Criminal Justice

Bowling Green State University (BGSU) is seeking applicants for a tenure-track position in Criminal Justice at the Assistant or Associate Professor level starting August 2019. The Criminal Justice program is one of the fastest growing programs on campus and currently serves over 500 students. The program offers a BS in Criminal Justice, including a specialization in forensic investigations, a MS in Criminal Justice with both a face-to-face cohort and an on-line cohort, and a MS in Forensic Science with a specialization in Forensic Investigations. The primary responsibilities include teaching at the graduate and undergraduate level in the criminal justice programs; establishing a record of high quality research and publication; student advising; supervising graduate students; participation in curriculum design; and providing professional service through community engagement and professional societies. Responsibilities also include participation in collaborative and cross-disciplinary teaching, research and service. Candidates are required to hold a PhD in Criminal Justice/Criminology or closely related field. ABD candidates will be given consideration with evidence provided of completion of the PhD by the start date. A Juris Doctorate degree alone does not serve as a qualification for this position. Preferred candidates will have experience teaching some combination of introduction to criminal justice; victimology; corrections; race, class, and criminal justice; or ethics.
