

## Farmingdale State College - Assistant Professor - Criminal Justice

Farmingdale State is a public college of applied science and technology with an enrollment of more than 9,200 undergraduate and graduate students and a rich history of over 80,000 graduates. As the largest of SUNY's colleges of technology, Farmingdale equips students with the resources and knowledge sought by today's emerging industries. A total of 31 undergraduate degree programs are offered within four schools: Arts & Sciences, Business, Engineering Technology, and Health Sciences. Academic programs also include a graduate program beginning in the Fall of 2017. Small classes with nationally recognized faculty, technology-enhanced classrooms, state-of-the-art information services as well as a highly successful NCAA Division III athletics program, make Farmingdale State one of the fastest-growing colleges in the region, and in the State University of New York system.

Located on 380 lush acres in the heart of Long Island, approximately 45 minutes from New York City, Farmingdale was named as one of the best colleges in the North in US News and World Report 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017. Farmingdale is proud of its many graduates with 91% indicating that they are continuing their education or are working in their field of specialization. The Criminal Justice Department invites applications for a tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor with a start date of fall of 2019. We are seeking a highly qualified candidate who has a strong background in the field of criminal justice, and who has demonstrated excellence in teaching in the field of criminal justice at the college level. A Ph.D. in Criminal Justice, Criminology or a related field from a regionally accredited institution must be completed by the time of the appointment. A record of scholarly achievement and professional experience in the area of criminal justice systems, processes, policy, law or theory is highly desirable, including research leading to peer-reviewed publications.

The successful candidates will be expected to demonstrate effective teaching at the undergraduate level, both in face-to-face classes and in an online format, with a teaching load of 12 hours per semester. Currency in the field of criminal justice, utilization of appropriate instructional technology, and incorporation of applied learning experiences will be important elements of successful teaching in the program. An agenda of scholarship that complements his or her area of academic specialization and that has the potential for peer-reviewed publications and presentations will be expected. This will include involvement in professional associations and seeking other opportunities for professional growth. The successful candidate will also be expected to contribute to the functioning of the institution at the department, school, and college-wide level, including student advisement and mentoring, curriculum development, and participation in campus governance. Achievement in all of these areas is necessary for continuing appointment (tenure) and promotion at the college.

All faculty members at Farmingdale State College have three workload components: teaching, research and scholarly activity, and service. The successful candidate will demonstrate an interest and high level of competence in teaching. Candidates should have a research agenda that complements their area of academic specialty resulting in peer-reviewed publications and presentation, both of which are necessary for promotion and tenure at Farmingdale State College.

The service component of the workload includes student advisement as well as active participation on departmental, school and college-wide committees. The faculty member will be expected to teach in multiple formats including hybrid, online and traditional face-to-face classes.

- An earned PhD. in Criminal Justice, Criminology or a related field from a regionally accredited institution.
- A record of scholarly achievement and professional experience in the area of criminal justice systems, processes, policy, law or theory.
- A history of successful college-level teaching in Criminal Justice, Criminology or a related field.

#### **PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Applicant should possess excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
