Tenure-Track Assistant Professor Position**

The Department of Criminology and Justice at Loyola University New Orleans invites applications for one tenure-track assistant professor position, to begin in August 2018. A Ph.D. in Sociology, Criminology, Criminal Justice, or closely related discipline from an accredited institution is required by the time of hire. The department seeks criminologists with online course design and online teaching experience. The position will maintain a 3-3 course load, including teaching online and in-person courses for both undergraduate and graduate degree programs. Research specialties are open, but special consideration will be given to candidates with expertise in corrections, cyber crime, or international/comparative criminology, and teaching statistics and research methodology. In addition to course development and teaching, the position includes advising students, active scholarship (including regular publishing and seeking external funding), and committee service.
