Candidates should have expertise and research interests in the broad field of criminology / criminal justice policy, and a completed PhD (or be close to obtaining one) in criminology or a related area by the post start date. They must have a track record or trajectory of internationally excellent publications, plus proven ability or potential to publish in top journals or with leading book publishers. Also required is a clear, well developed and viable strategy for future outstanding research that has the potential to result in world-leading publications, together with the ability to establish an international reputation. Candidates must have the ability to teach core and specialist criminology courses at BSc, MSc, and PhD levels, and to contribute to other core courses at BSc level in the department, and also have a commitment to high quality teaching and fostering a positive learning environment for students, including pastoral care.
