Candidates should have a Ph.D. in criminology, criminal justice, or a related social science discipline. A JD or Ed.D. will not be considered as a terminal degree for this position. All specializations will be considered. Preference will be given to those who research the intersection of race and crime; or those who conduct applied research as it relates to criminal justice agencies. ABDs may be considered if evidence can be shown that completion of the Ph.D. will occur prior to fall 2019. Successful applicants are expected to have evidence of scholarly research, teaching excellence, and the ability to engage in scholar/practitioner partnerships to enhance the functioning of criminal justice agencies.
