The Opportunity

The School of Social Sciences at Monash University in Melbourne, Australia seeks applications for a continuing appointment as a Lecturer (Assistant Professor equivalent) in Criminology. The School of Social Sciences is recognised internationally for its quality education, innovative research and international engagement.

Monash University is the largest university in Australia and regularly ranks in the top 100 universities worldwide. Monash has six globally networked campuses and international alliances in Europe and Asia. The two appointments will be based at the Clayton campus in Melbourne. Melbourne was named the "Most Liveable City in the World" for seven consecutive years by The Economist.

Criminology at Monash is internationally renowned for its global focus on crimes that cause widespread, measurable harm and the prevention of these harms. Monash criminologists examine crime and crime control in a time of massive social change and global mobility. We have a strong research culture, led by a dynamic group of researchers. Monash Criminology is distinct in Australia for its consistent success in attracting national and international competitive funding for major research. We are research leaders in global fields of inquiry including migration and border regulation, human trafficking and the exclusion and exploitation of vulnerable populations. We lead national and international research on domestic violence, policing and imprisonment with an emerging profile in cyber-crime and community crime prevention. Monash Criminology consistently delivers excellence in teaching and supervision. We teach over 2600 undergraduates every year in units that are closely aligned with our research strengths, and we supervise over 25 post graduate students. In 2019, we are launching our Bachelor of Criminology Degree. This will be a cutting edge program aimed at equipping students with the professional skills, specialist knowledge and key capabilities relevant to careers in a wide range of Criminology related fields.

Applicants demonstrating potential and achievement in core fields of research and teaching in Criminology will be seriously considered.

Strong quantitative skills are desired and while preference will be given to those with expertise in crime prevention and policing, we encourage applicants in other criminological subfields to apply.
