Nevada State College invites applications for an Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice with an emphasis in Law and Society and Social Justice to begin in August 2019.

About Nevada State College

Founded in 2002, Nevada State College (NSC) is a four-year public college located on a developing 500-acre campus in the foothills of Henderson, Nevada (adjacent to Las Vegas). Our faculty members enjoy the rare opportunity to mold the college as it continues to grow into a cornerstone of higher education in Southern Nevada. NSC faculty work in state-of-the-art facilities that feature “smart” classrooms and a Finance Lab that allows students to use real-world and timely information during class. NSC serves approximately 4,200 students who are highly diverse and largely underserved; a majority of our students are first generation, racial/ethnic minorities, parents, and/or returning students. As a teaching-oriented institution, our faculty focus on high-quality instruction, engaging learning experiences, and innovative techniques to improve student learning.

At Nevada State College, we celebrate the storied backgrounds of our campus community. We operate with a shared commitment to represent and serve the diverse population of Nevada and to encourage the exchange of ideas that respects and honors the lived experiences of our students, staff, and faculty. We foster a culture of inclusive excellence so our members can live authentically, fully engage, and flourish. To strengthen the college and progress its mission, the college dedicates itself to intentional and ongoing reflection to meet the evolving needs of NSC, the surrounding communities, and the State of Nevada.

Primary Responsibilities

- Teach lower- and upper-level courses in criminal justice in a variety of formats (e.g., in-person, hybrid, online).
- Help grow and maintain our criminal justice major and minor.
- Serve on departmental and college-wide committees.
- Engage in scholarly activity within the discipline or in the scholarship of teaching and learning.
- The teaching load is 4/4, but new faculty members teach a reduced, 3/3 course load their first year.

Minimum Qualifications

- Ph.D. in Criminal Justice, Criminology, Sociology, Justice or Legal Studies, or related field in the social and behavioral sciences.
- Demonstrated excellence in teaching and a genuine interest in joining NSC, a teaching college dedicated to providing opportunities for a largely underserved student population.
- Eligibility to work in the United States (NSC does not sponsor visas for international employees).
- Background in the study or application of social justice issues.

Preferred Qualifications

- Ability to teach a majority of the following courses: CRJ 222 Criminal Law & Procedure, CRJ 321 Immigration & Justice, CRJ 411 Comparative Criminal Justice Systems, and CRJ 463 Victimology.
- Ability to bring an international or comparative approach to criminal justice.
- Experience with or desire to teach online and/or hybrid courses.

Rank, Salary & Benefits

- Tenure-track, Assistant Professor level.
- Budget annual salary is \$64,000 (for a 9-month contract).
- Excellent benefits, including 14.5% retirement match, 11 paid holidays, beginning balance of 30 sick leave days, educational benefits, and two health insurance plans that can be supplemented with flexible spending accounts or health savings accounts.

As a teaching college working with an underserved population, we place a high emphasis on translating our academic preparation into exemplary classroom experiences through our dedication to quality instruction and mentoring. You will work in technology-rich facilities and are encouraged to explore creative ideas and techniques to improve student learning.
