Position Description

The Clara Luper Department of African & African American Studies, housed in College of Arts & Sciences (CAS) at the University of Oklahoma, is beginning a multi-year period of expansion and renewal. As part of the growth of this progressive unit, applications are being solicited for an outstanding faculty member at the rank of Associate Professor / Full Professor in Criminal Justice Reform. Applicants specializing in incarcerated women or race, gender, and crime are especially preferred. The position is a nine-month appointment and includes teaching four courses each academic year.
