The person appointed will be expected to engage in advanced study and research in a substantive area of Criminology using quantitative methods, and to give high-quality seminars, classes, supervision, lectures, and tutorials, at both undergraduate and graduate level. In particular, the post-holder will be responsible for delivering instruction in quantitative research methods at the Centre for Criminology and in the wider Law faculty.

Applicants must hold a doctorate in a relevant social science subject, have relevant teaching experience, have conducted and published empirical research using quantitative methods, be able to develop course materials and research proposals, have a research record of international standing, and have the potential to secure external research funding. Associate professors who are awarded the title of full professor may receive from the University an additional salary payment of £2,700 per annum.
