

Assistant Professor Position – Department of Sociology, Criminal Justice, and Criminology

The Department of Sociology, Criminal Justice, and Criminology at the University of Scranton is now accepting applications for a full-time tenure track position at the Assistant Professor level to begin spring or fall 2019. Preference will be given to applicants with an interest in teaching and developing courses in the areas of cybercrime, cybersecurity, and terrorism. Applicants must possess a terminal degree (Ph.D.) in criminology, criminal justice, or closely related field and should provide evidence of effective teaching, a solid research agenda, and a commitment to service that would support the mission of the University of Scranton. The J.D. is not considered a terminal degree for this position. Previous teaching experience in an academic setting is preferred.
