

St. Thomas Aquinas College, Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice (tenure track) to teach required and elective courses in both the undergraduate major, and in the Master of Public Administration in Criminal Justice Administration program. Courses might include criminology, policing, courts and the legal system, corrections, quantitative research methods, evaluation and evidence-based research, public and non-profit administration, and contemporary issues for criminal justice administration. The candidate will also advise undergraduates, serve as MPA-CJ thesis adviser, assist in the continued development of the MPA-CJ, and provide service to the major and the college. Priority given to candidates who can combine applied and theoretical emphases in their teaching. Start date is open.

Qualifications: Relevant college teaching experience is expected; earned PhD in criminology/criminal justice, public administration, or closely related discipline (sociology, social policy, psychology) required. A J.D. will be considered if the candidate additionally holds a criminal justice-related degree. The College prides itself on the high quality of the teaching of its faculty as well as their scholarly contributions to their discipline; therefore, a successful candidate should be able to demonstrate experience balancing these expectations.
