

The Department of Sociology at The University of Alabama in Huntsville invites applications for a tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor beginning August 2019. Ideal candidates will be serious educators and scholars with excellent teaching skills and a research agenda with potential for peer-reviewed publications in the discipline. We are looking for broadly trained sociologists or criminologists (with a sociological background) who can teach Introduction to Criminology and upper level electives related to criminology. The ideal candidate will also be able to teach Sociology of Gender and courses in research methods or statistics. The regular teaching load is three courses per semester, including both online and traditional courses. A Ph.D. is required by the date of appointment. Applications should include: 1) a cover letter, 2) a curriculum vitae, 3) a copy of graduate transcripts, 4) a writing sample, and 5) evidence of teaching excellence and should be sent as a single pdf document to the Sociology Search Committee Chair at UAHSociologyposition@uah.edu. Three letters of recommendation should be sent separately to the same address. Review of applications will begin on November 15 and continue until the position is filled.
