Position Description: The Department of Sociology and Criminal Justice invites applications for a non-tenure track Visiting Assistant Professor position to begin Fall 2018. The successful candidate will teach four online courses per semester, with the opportunity for additional summer assignments for extra compensation. Teaching responsibilities will be primarily criminal justice/criminology distance education courses, such as Introduction to Criminal Justice, Introduction to Criminology, Police and Society, and Social Data Analysis. Salary is very competitive. The faculty member is expected to fully participate in departmental activities on the UA campus.

The University of Arkansas is a Carnegie RU/VH research institution, with an enrollment of over 27,000 students. Located in beautiful Northwest Arkansas, Fayetteville is consistently rated among the top places to live and work in the U.S. The Department currently offers undergraduate degrees in Sociology and Criminal justice, a M.A. in Sociology, has recently implemented an online undergraduate criminal justice minor, and has proposed the development of an online criminology major.

Qualifications: A Ph.D. in Criminology, Criminal Justice, Sociology, or related social science discipline is required. ABD candidates will be considered. The area of specialization is open. Successful candidates will have experience teaching core criminology/criminal justice courses and statistics, experience teaching online courses and face-to-face courses, demonstrated commitment to quality teaching, and active research agenda

Appointment/Start Date: August 2018. Initial appointment is for up to three years, with potential for renewal/reappointment.
