Position/Rank and Salary: The Department of Sociology and Criminology at the University of Arkansas invites applications for a tenured position at the rank of Senior Associate or Full Professor. The selected candidate also will serve as the director of the Terrorism Research Center in Fulbright College. Salary is very competitive, with typical teaching load of two courses per semester negotiable relative to grant management.

Qualifications: A Ph.D. in sociology, criminology, criminal justice, or related social science discipline at the time of appointment is required. As director of the Terrorism Research Center in Fulbright College (TRC), the successful candidate will assume managerial control over the American Terrorism Study (ATS). Candidates with a working knowledge of the ATS are preferred. Preferred candidates also will have a demonstrated publication and funding record as well as expertise in quantitative, qualitative, or mixed methods sufficient to maximize the research capabilities of the ATS. The new director must have successful experience in acquiring, managing, and completing federally funded research, while also engaging with local, state, and federal agencies relative to the application and usage of TRC and ATS research. Applicants with research that adds to departmental and research center strengths in the areas of community or crime will be considered a plus.
