The appointment will be on UCL Grade 7. The salary range will be £35,328 to £42,701 per annum, inclusive of London Allowance.

Post-Doctoral Research Fellow - From coercion to consent: social identity, legitimacy, and a process model of police procedural justice (CONSIL).

This is an exciting opportunity to work on an ESRC funded project testing and advancing interdisciplinary theoretical understanding of some of the core causal claims of Procedural Justice Theory.

Drawing upon the latest developments in contemporary social psychological and criminological theory, the project is run in partnership between Keele University, University College London and the London School of Economics.

This role will involve working directly with our project partners, supporting the design of the research methodology, and then utilising an ethnographic framework to obtain direct semi-structured observational data of a series of police interactions with marginalised groups across a range of contexts, as well as other secondary data. The post-holder will then organize, code and otherwise analyse the data corpus, help draft journal articles and be involved in other forms of dissemination and impact activity.

The post is currently funded for 24 months.

To qualify, candidates must have a PhD/DPhil degree in a relevant discipline and experience in the gathering and analysis of qualitative data, and particularly ethnographic methods.

Experience with working in a policing context, as well as an understanding of Procedural Justice Theory and/or Self Categorisation Theory, would be valuable.

You should enjoy working as part of a team, have good communication skills and also display motivation and commitment to globally relevant research in a fast-paced and competitive field.
