

Full-time Lecturer in the Department of Criminal Justice & Criminology at the University of North Carolina, Charlotte

The Department of Criminal Justice and Criminology at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte invites applications for a full time lecturer position. Start date: August 15, 2019 (possible). Initial appointment 3 years with the possibility of reappointment(s) depending upon performance. Requirements include: (1) a Master's degree in Criminal Justice or a related discipline at the time of appointment, (2) the ability to teach introductory and secondary undergraduate courses in areas across the discipline, and (3) the ability to advise a diverse student population on major requirements and other areas. Previous teaching and/or practical experience is preferred. The workload of a lecturer includes teaching (typically 4 courses a semester), service work and potentially advising responsibilities. Finalists will be asked during their screening interview to discuss how the topics of diversity and inclusion are incorporated into their teaching.

The Department. The Department consists of fourteen tenure-track faculty members and three full-time lecturers. B.A. and M.S. degrees are offered in Criminal Justice & Criminology and the Department contributes to the Interdisciplinary Ph.D. Program in Public Policy and the Data Science and Business Analytics Program. The department will also partner with a proposed Ph.D. program in Data Science where Crime Analytics will be a domain of concentration.
