The Department of Criminology & Criminal Justice is seeking applications for a tenure-track faculty member at the rank of Assistant Professor, beginning August 1, 2019. It is a nine-month position with summer teaching possibilities. Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience. Responsibilities include teaching, research, and service.

Candidates must have a Ph.D. in Criminology, Criminal Justice, or a closely related discipline with a clear criminological focus from an accredited institution, a clearly articulated research agenda, and a commitment to academic excellence and collegiality. The ideal candidate will have a firm foundation to teach a range of criminology & criminal justice courses. Particularly desirable are specialties or teaching interest in juvenile delinquency, corrections, comparative criminal justice systems, research methods, and statistics. Highly qualified ABD candidates will be considered if completion of the degree is imminent.
