Job duties: The successful candidate will be expected to pursue an active research agenda, teach undergraduate and graduate criminal justice courses in both our core curriculum and in substantive topics related to the applicant's specialty area, and engage in service at the university and in the discipline.

Qualifications: A PhD in Criminal Justice, Criminology, or closely related fields is required prior to appointment. Specialty area is open.
