Assistant/Associate Professor of Homeland Security and Emergency Management in the Department of Criminal Justice

The Department of Criminal Justice at Auburn University at Montgomery seeks to fill a tenure track position in Homeland Security and Emergency Management, and/or criminal justice, which will start August 2019. Candidates will be considered at either the assistant or associate level. To be considered at the associate level candidates must have a demonstrated record of research and publication in peer reviewed journals and a strong record of teaching. Priority will be given to candidates with a record of scholarship and teaching in the area of Homeland Security and Emergency Management. The Department has Master's Degree Programs in both Criminal Justice and Homeland Security and Emergency Management. Primary teaching responsibilities will involve teaching courses in Homeland Security and Emergency Management and must be able to teach criminal justice graduate and undergraduate courses in the applicants' area of specialty both in traditional classroom and online settings.

The successful applicant must be committed to educational equity in a multicultural setting and to promoting and fostering a learning environment that is supportive of individuals from diverse backgrounds and with diverse perspectives. Although consideration will be given to ABD, a Ph.D. in Criminal Justice, Criminology, Homeland Security and Emergency Management or other related social science field is required by the successful candidate's. The J.D. alone is not sufficient for this position.
