Assistant Professor Position

The Steven J. Green School of International and Public Affairs invites applicants for a tenure-track Assistant Professor position in its Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice. Start date is August 2019. A Ph.D. in criminal justice, criminology, or related field is required. Applicants are expected to have a strong record of publication, and the potential for securing external funding. Although all areas of specialization will be considered, preference will be given to applicants who specialize in prosecution and sentencing and can teach advanced quantitative classes in the department’s doctoral program in International Crime and Justice. Salary is nationally competitive and commensurate with experience. The Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice currently has 18 full-time faculty members, enrolls about 2,000 majors, and offers Bachelor of Science degrees in Crime Science and Criminal Justice, a Master of Science degree in Criminal Justice, and a Doctor of Philosophy degree in International Crime and Justice.
